

Cultural route of the Council of Euro Itinéraire culturel du Conseil de l'Euro



The Iron Age Danube Route addresses one of the most fragile, though imposing and attractive prehistoric archaeological phenomenon, the Iron Age landscapes.

Characterized by monumental structures, such as burial mound cemeteries, flat cemeteries, fortified hilltop settlements and oppida, as well as elements indicating the complex organization of space, Iron Age land-scapes belong to the period between the 9<sup>th</sup> and the end of the 1st century BC.

In addition, the Iron Age is a period marked by an extraordinary corpus of movable, as well as intangible heritage, which is kept in numerous museums of the Danube region, including the most important regional and national institutions.

Compiling existing sources of knowledge and creating a strong interdisciplinary and international network of expert institutions from Austria, Croatia, Hungary and Slovenia in the fields of archaeology, cultural heritage protection, tourism, as well as local stakeholders, the Iron Age Danube Route Association was founded in July 2020 with the aim of further development and management of the IADR.

Along with the efforts of the Iron Age Danube Route Association, the Iron Age Danube Route is going to be advanced through the Interreg Danube Transnational project "Virtual archaeological landscapes of the Danube region" (July 2020 - December 2022). This project centres around making archaeological landscapes of the Danube region more visible and attractive for their successful integration into sustainable cultural tourism on regional, national and international levels.

### IRON AGE DANUBE ROUTE ASSOCIATION

The IADR Association is a non-governmental, non-profit, cultural organization dedicated to the promotion, research, protection and sustainable development of the Iron Age heritage in the Danube region.

The Association serves as platform through which the established partnership can work on making the Iron Age cultural heritage more visible and accessible while, at the same time, creating economic and cultural added value for local communities inhabiting it today.



### DOCUMENTATION NECESSARY

## FOR THE DETERMINATION AND ASSIGNMENT OF PIN (OIB) FOREIGN LEGAL ENTITY

- 1) Request for the determination and assignment of PIN (OIB) (Annex 1).
- 2) Deed of Establishment (decision or registry excerpt from the competent court, in the Croatian language or translated into the Croatian language by a certified court interpreter).
- 3) The Power of Attorney for the procedure of determination and assignment of PIN.

Since Croatian is the official language of the Republic of Croatia, the power of attorney shall be drawn up in the Croatian language or translated into the Croatian language. The Power of attorney will be kept at the competent Tax Administration office and shall be certified by a notary public only in exceptional cases, if there is doubt of its credibility. If the power of attorney was issued to a notary public, attorney, body established under public law, or bank, the certification of the power of attorney is not necessary. If the Application is submitted by a natural person for a foreign person, the certification of the power of attorney is necessary. In order to facilitate the process, for the IADR Association candidate members PIN request will be submitted by the Archaeological Museum in Zagreb (a body established by public law) based on the power of attorney given to it by the candidate organisation (Annex 2).
